

Garner's Field Campsite

'Garner's Field' is the name of Farnham District Scout Association's campsite just outside Farnham in Surrey. Details of the campsite's features, facilities and site use requirements can be found below.

History

The site and much of the surrounding area was formerly a quarry which had been filled in. Under the leadership of former Farnham District Commissioner Eric Garner the site was purchased in the 1970's for Scouting Activities and the site named in his honour.

Location

Garner's Field is located in a rural setting approximately three miles south of Farnham near the village of Tilford. The site is easily accessible by vehicles (but not coaches) via a single track from nearby Sheephatch Lane, Tilford.

The campsite is at OS Map Reference 865447.

On OS Explorer Map 145, 'Garner's Field' (name not marked) adjoins the Surrey County Girl Guide's 'Heron's Wey Camp Site' (name marked).

OS Pathfinder Sheet SU 84/94 also covers the area.

When coming to the site from Farnham via the Tilford Road, take the left turn into Sheephatch lane, proceed over the small river bridge and take the left turn immediately after the house adjacent to the bridge. Proceed along the single track to Garner's Field passing 'Heron's Wey' Girl Guide site entrance to your right.

Site

The campsite comprises a seven acre mainly level field adjacent to the river Wey with individual camping areas located around the periphery. A large central open grassed area is provided for communal use.

A Weather Shelter is provided near the car park for the temporary stowage of camping equipment and refuge from the weather. Please note that due the fire risk the use of gas equipment or open fires in this shelter is not permitted.

Fresh/drinking water pipe stands are provided around the main field and adjacent to the buildings.

Wood is delivered to the site for camp fires and cooking - only this wood or dead wood collected from the ground may be burned. With the Warden's prior permission open fires may be used at the individual camping areas located adjacent to the river. Fire pits are to be dug and filled in accordance with scouting guidelines. Altar fires may be used at the remaining camping areas (five altar fire/BBQ's are available for use on a first come basis). Please use axes and saws responsibly.

Individual camping area waste/grey water drainage facilities should be built above ground near the field boundaries (for example using a perforated bucket or bin liner filled with filter material that can later be burned). Please do not dig wet pits, throw wet refuse into the hedgerows or pour anything into the river.

Facilities

The site has a modern purpose built stand alone toilet block with separate male and female facilities including toilets, showers, wet rooms, disabled facilities and an external washing up area with hot and cold water.

The site Activity Centre is available for hire on a daily or weekly basis and comprises an Assembly Hall with internal toilets (including disabled) and a kitchen. The recently refurbished kitchen includes a gas hob with five burners, a gas oven range with five burners plus large oven and small oven/grill, refrigerator, freezer, electric hot water urn, microwave, toaster and electric kettle. Groups using the Kitchen are to provide their own cooking pots, pans, utensils etc. A small charge per day is made to cover gas use.

Please note, supplementary portable gas cooking stoves or equipment may only be used in the kitchen - no portable gas burning appliances or equipment are to be used in the Assembly Hall.

The hall has capacity to seat 80 people with folding tables and chairs provided. The hall may be used for sleepovers with the Warden's prior permission. Heating for the main hall is available via a meter accepting £1 coins.

A history folder on Garner's Field plus leaflets for local attractions can be found in the main hall and on the notice board.

The Garner's Field Campsite badge can be purchased from the Booking Secretary or Warden, or obtained from the local Farnham District Scout Shop.

Facilities are available in the local area for gas bottle exchange. Nearest location is 'Camping & Leisure World' part of Frensham Garden Centre, The Reeds Road, Farnham, GU10 3BP (Tel 01252-795293) approximately 2 miles from Garner's Field.

Nearest Hospitals with Emergency/Casualty departments are located:

- Frimley Park Hospital, GU16 7HB – approx. 12 miles
- Royal Surrey County Hospital, GU2 7XX – approx. 12 miles

There are numerous Doctor's Surgeries and a Community Hospital in the Farnham area.

There are no mail delivery or permanent telephone facilities at the site.

Please note that the Warden or members of the Scouting Association site maintenance team are not normally permanently on site but may visit from time to time.

Activities

All activities conducted at Garner's Field are to be in accordance with the latest edition of the Scout Association's Rules and Guidelines as detailed in POR (Policy Organisation and Rules). Groups visiting the campsite are to prepare a written Risk Assessment for the activities they will be undertaking and hold a copy on site for review. A Risk Assessment for the campsite's facilities including its buildings, camping and activity areas and Farnham District owned equipment - but not any activities, has been pre-prepared and is available on request.

The Shooting and Archery wall may be used for Rifle shooting (.177 only) or Archery. Instructors must be qualified in accordance with POR. Groups are to supply their own Shooting and Archery equipment unless a prior arrangement has been made with

Farnham District. When bringing own rifles or archery equipment to site please ensure that the Warden's prior permission has been obtained.

A purpose built Adventure Trail activity course is located within a fenced area at the site (entrance lock combination available from the Booking Secretary or Warden). To be used with a Leader in attendance.

A store of pioneering poles is available and permanent ground holding facilities are in place to erect a zip wire – Groups to supply own ropes, blocks and pulleys.

A launch/access area to the river is provided. The water depth is usually shallow and thereby suitable for rafting, canoeing and swimming. A small stock of drums is available on site to help with building rafts.

Water activities run from Garner's Field are to be contained within the river stretch adjacent to the field with care not to proceed downstream further than the sluice warning notice. A cordoned lookout platform is provided midway along the Garner's Field stretch of riverside to help oversee water activities Access to the far side river bank is not permitted as this is private property.

All users of the site are strictly forbidden to use or play in the river near the old sluice or to enter the adjacent fenced off bank areas which can be very dangerous.

A lifebuoy and line is provided on the adjacent bank for use in emergencies.

The river is normally rated as Class "C" waters excluding the out of bounds sluice area. If the river is high due to heavy rains the Class "C" is raised to "B1" and is not suitable for instruction or use. Appropriately qualified Leaders or Instructors must be in attendance during any water activities. A rope swing is provided over the river just upstream from the lookout point - please use under supervision.

The copse above the left lower field may be used for back woods camping and training.

All of the above are available at no charge however please advise the Booking Secretary in advance if it is your intention to use any of these.

A series of three basic orienteering trails have been set up at Garner's Field. Copies of the Information Pack explaining the trail routes are available from the Booking Secretary for a small charge.

A 12 metre purpose built Climbing and Abseiling Tower (installed Spring 2011) is available for use on a pre-booked basis. A hire charge will apply for its use. Groups are to supply their own Instructors and climbing equipment unless a prior agreement has been made with Farnham District. The Tower is to be used strictly in accordance with POR with appropriately qualified personnel supervising all climbing activities. Only those involved in climbing or preparing to climb are permitted inside the Tower perimeter fence.

Local Interests

The old market town of Farnham includes its Castle, excellent shopping facilities, sports centre, museum and rail link to London. The nearby village of Tilford can be reached along a bridle path with the Bourne Woods also close by and easily reachable from the site.

Other nearby attractions include:- Frensham Ponds and the surrounding common, Hankley Common including the 'Devil's Jumps', the Old Kiln Museum, the Devil's

Punchbowl, Birdworld, Waverley Abbey ruins and Alice Holt Forest's 'Go Ape' high wire adventure course (note this latter facility is at Bucks Horn Oak - 6 miles from the site). Nearby Aldershot and Farnborough include a number of attractions including several Military Museums and a dry ski slope.

Farnham District's Scout Shop is located in the centre of Farnham and open during the School Term; Thursday evenings 6 to 8 pm and Saturday mornings 9.30 am to Noon. See '<http://www.farnhamscouting.com/scoutshop.html>' for a map and more information.

Site Use Rules

In complying with POR whilst visiting Garner's Field particular attention is drawn for the need of adults to meet the specified CRB (Criminal Records Bureau) check requirements.

Everyone using the site and its amenities is asked to behave in a considerate way so that all can equally enjoy the facilities. The site can accommodate up to 120 young people camping on the top field with a further 40 on the lower field right and 20 on the lower field left. Please note it is usual for several different Groups to be using the site at any one time. Noise should be reduced to a minimum between 8 pm and 7.30 am and all at the site are expected to be quiet with lights out by 11.00 pm - offenders failing to comply may be asked to leave the campsite.

Groups of young people who are members of the Scout Association visiting or camping at Garner's Field and who are under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a minimum of two adults. Prior to arrival the Leader in charge should advise the Warden of the group's expected arrival time and before departure the Warden should be contacted and invited to visit the site.

Small hike groups of Scout Association members under the age of 18 years may camp without adult supervision providing details of a home contact have been provided prior to arrival. D of E hiking groups coming on to site for short stays must have a Leader ready to supervise their arrival and stay.

By exception alcohol in moderation is permitted on site at the discretion of the Leader in Charge providing; a) adults refrain from drinking alcohol when directly responsible for young people and b) a minimum of two adults refrain from drinking alcohol whenever young people are on site or camping. Young people under the age of 18 years are not under any circumstances permitted to consume alcohol during their stay.

Drugs are strictly prohibited other than those prescribed by a registered medical practitioner.

Smoking is not permitted on site in the presence of young people or in enclosed areas i.e. Assembly Building, Toilet Block or Weather Shelter. Adults who smoke should do so responsibly away from and out of site of young people.

The site is surrounded by private fields and tracks which must not be crossed without the Warden's expressed permission. Groups arriving/leaving the site should proceed quietly passed the house and stables by the site entrance at Sheephatch Lane. The adjacent camping/activity field 'Herons Wey' is owned by the Surrey County Guide Association and will normally be out of bounds as is the adjacent small holding farm. Nearby grazing animals should be respected and not disturbed. Please note the discharge of fireworks or

causing of loud noises or explosions is not permitted as it frightens nearby animals and live stock. Generators are not permitted on site.

The single unmade track to/from Garner's Field from Sheephatch Lane can become congested during periods of high traffic activity and may become rutted with use in wet weather. Please use the track with care and consideration for others. A maximum speed limit of 5 mph is to be strictly applied when using the track or driving on the camp site.

Once equipment has been dropped off at individual campsites ALL vehicles are to be removed back to the marked parking areas near the main field entrance. Campervans or caravans may only be brought on site with the Warden's prior permission.

On departure toilets, sinks and showers, washing up sinks and if used the Activity Centre (and in particular the Kitchen and its equipment) are to be properly cleaned and left tidy with all waste and debris removed. Individual Campsite areas are to be left tidy with all litter and equipment removed and any fire pits properly filled in. Failure to do this to the Warden's satisfaction may result in loss of deposit.

Activity areas and the camp fire area are to be left tidy with all wood returned to the wood pile. Borrowed Altar fires, picnic tables, benches, unused fire wood and pioneering equipment are to be returned to their proper locations.

There are no facilities for rubbish disposal at the site and other than burning, all rubbish should be removed from the site by individual Groups. Please do not bury rubbish as foxes find it, dig it up and scatter it.

Dogs (other than guide dogs) or other pets are not encouraged. If dogs are brought to site then they are to be kept on a lead at all times.

When on site and visiting surrounding areas please observe the Country Code.

Leader Responsibility

Leaders are individually responsible for the safety and well being of their Group on site. It is the Group Leader's responsibility to ensure his/her Group are in compliance with POR - in particular where shooting, archery, climbing and water activities are involved. The Warden or his nominee may request the sighting of the appropriate Permit, Certificate or Risk Assessment for planned activities.

Those making use of the Activity Hall and Kitchen should familiarise themselves with the fire escapes, portable fire fighting equipment, smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, gas isolation location, general safety features and safe equipment use.

In the unfortunate event of a personal accident or injury occurring at site the individual Group's own response/reporting procedures should be followed first and any injury treated. The Garner's Field Warden or Booking Secretary should then be notified as soon as practical. If facilities or equipment at the site are found damaged or defective the item(s) should first be made safe and if necessary isolated, then the Warden notified.

Bookings, Costs and Further Information

Please note all camps, overnight stays and day or evening visits at Garner's Field are to be pre-booked via the Booking Secretary.

All bookings are to be accompanied by a deposit, failure of which to pay may invalidate the booking.

Outstanding camping and activity fees should be settled prior to departure.
